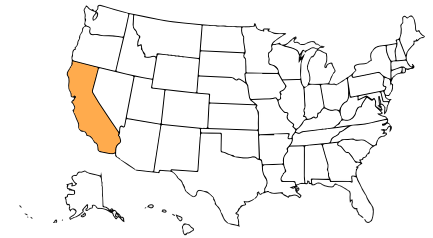

Scholarships

The University of La Verne offers competitive merit scholarships to all international undergraduate applicants. There is no separate application process. All applicants are considered upon review of a completed and timely submitted application. Scholarships are automatically renewed for all students in good academic standing with a minimum GPA of 3.0.

Freshman Scholarships

President's Scholarship (\$23,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a (B+/A-) 3.5 average in high school/secondary school and 1240 SAT, 26+ ACT, 95+ TOEFL iBT or 8.0+ IELTS.

Provost's Scholarship (\$21,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a (B+/A-) 3.5 average in high school/secondary school and 1170-1239 SAT, 24-25+ ACT, 90+ TOEFL iBT or 7.5+ IELTS.

Trustee's Scholarship (\$17,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a (B) 3.0 average in high school/secondary school and 1250 SAT, 24+ ACT, 90+ TOEFL iBT or 7.5 IELTS.

Dean's Scholarship (\$16,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a (B+/A-) 3.5 average in high school/secondary school and 1100-1169 SAT, 23+ ACT, 85+ TOEFL iBT or 7.0+ IELTS.

Director's International Scholarship (\$5,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a (B) 3.0 average in high school/secondary school or who have completed ELS Language Center's level 112.

Transfer Scholarships

International Trustee's Scholarship (\$15,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a cumulative GPA of 3.50+ in university coursework.

International Founder's Scholarship (\$13,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a cumulative GPA of 3.21-3.49 in university coursework.

International Leo's Scholarship (\$5,000 Annual Amount)

Applicants who have attained a cumulative GPA of 3.00-3.20 in university coursework.

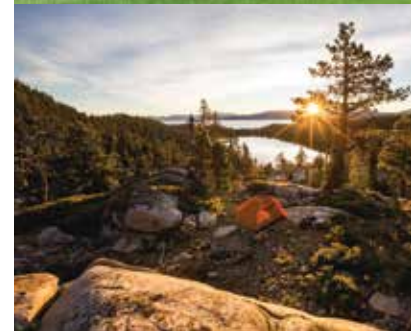
Applying for Financial Aid

All applicants seeking need-based financial aid must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.ed.gov.

Contact your high school counselor or college financial aid office for forms.

1 October is the opening day to begin filing the FAFSA. (La Verne's FAFSA code: 001216)

Application Checklist

STEP 1

Application for Admission

Complete application using the La Verne Application for Admission or the Common Application.

Visit univ.lv/international for application links.

STEP 2

Application Fees

The application fee for the University of La Verne is \$50. Please make checks or money orders payable to University of La Verne.

STEP 3

Personal Essay

The personal essay portion of the application allows us to get to know a little more about you. The essay will also demonstrate your ability to organize your thoughts and express yourself.

STEP 4

Official Transcripts

Make arrangements through your Registrar's office to obtain official high school or college transcripts and submit them to the Office of Admission. Transcripts should include grades through the most recent term.

STEP 5

Official Test Scores

- If you are applying for freshman admission, please submit official test scores from one of the below exams.
- A minimum score of 460 on the evidence-based reading and writing section of the SAT is required.
- A minimum score of 19 on the English section of the ACT is required.
- The La Verne identification code for the TOEFL is 4381. A minimum score of 80 with acceptable bandwidth scores is required.
- A minimum score of 6.5 on the IELTS with acceptable bandwidth scores is required.
- For more details on testing, please visit the English proficiency section of the international admission website.

Please note: Test scores may be submitted as part of the official transcript.

STEP 6

Letter of Recommendation

In order to better evaluate your application, we need one letter of recommendation submitted by a teacher, counselor, or someone that knows you in an academic setting.
