Three Ways to Transfer

1. Meet Transfer Admission Requirements

Successful candidates for admission will have fulfilled the following requirements prior to transferring to La Verne:

- 28 college-level semester units
- 2.7 GPA (minimum)
- One college-level English course

2. Apply for a Transfer Agreement Guarantee

The university has a Transfer Agreement Guarantee (TAG) with a number of California Community Colleges that guarantees admission if the student meets all requirements. Check out **univ.lv/tag** for more information and to apply for a TAG.

3. Complete an Associate's Degree for Transfer (ADT)

If you complete an Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) or Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T) degree in select majors from a participating California Community College, you will be guaranteed admission to the University of La Verne with a junior standing. The University of La Verne is on rolling admission. Applications received after the priority deadline will continue to be accepted as space permits.

Application Checklist

□ Apply for Admission

Visit **univ.lv/application** to apply — choose from the Common Application or the La Verne Application.

□ Pay Application Fee

Submit a \$50 application fee or contact your institution's transfer center to see if you qualify for a fee waiver.

☐ Submit a Personal Essay

Tell us something about yourself. The word count for the essay is 250 words. Make sure to proofread!

□ Submit Transcripts

Submit transcripts from every college you have attended to the Office of Admission. We will accept unofficial transcripts for admission consideration, but we will need final official transcripts directly from your school once you complete your in-progress coursework.

☐ Submit Letter of Recommendation (Optional)

Ask a professor, academic counselor, supervisor, etc. to write us a letter about your work ethic and character. This can be uploaded to the application portal or emailed to admission@laverne.edu.

The following are required only if you have completed fewer than 28 units at the time of enrollment:

☐ High School Transcripts

The University of La Verne is a test-optional institution, but you may also submit SAT/ACT scores if you feel that would strengthen your application.

Transfer Credit FAQs

What is the maximum number of units that will transfer to the University of La Verne?

A maximum of 88 college semester units may transfer upon review (including AP and IB credits).

How many units must I take at the University of La Verne?

All students are required to take at least 44 units at the university, including 16 upper division units and the La Verne Experience courses.

How are my credits evaluated for transfer?

Upon admission, the registrar's office reviews your transcripts and determines your course transferability. We accept the CSU and IGETC general education classes, Associate's Degree for Transfer, and other courses from regionally accredited institutions. Your advisor may work with you to ensure that as many of your credits as possible fulfill major requirements to accelerate your progress to a degree.

How many military credits can I transfer?

A maximum of 44 semester units may transfer.

La Verne General Education Requirements

Below is a checklist for the university's general education requirements; these are not required for admission. The courses may be taken at other institutions if approved for CSU-GE or IGETC general education requirements. Typically, general education credits earned from a regionally accredited institution are transferable to the university.

Types of Aid Available

Traditional undergraduate transfer students are eligible for generous merit scholarships based on their grade-point average at the time of admission. The scholarship is renewable each year as long as students stay in good academic standing and on track to graduate.



Grants

Grants are need-based awards that do not need to be repaid as long as the student maintains eligibility. The university offers students generous need-based aid to support their studies, in addition to state and federal aid that is available.



Federal Work-Study

Federal Work-Study is a paid work opportunity for students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to pay for educational expenses.



Loans

Unlike grants and scholarships, loans must be repaid.

Applying for Financial Aid

All applicants seeking need-based financial aid must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **studentaid.gov**. If you are a Dreamer in California, be sure to submit the California Dream Act Application at **dream.csac.ca.gov** by March 2.

- → October 1 is the opening day to begin filing the FAFSA La Verne's FAFSA code: **001216**.
- → California residents should also make sure their current CA school submits the GPA verification Form for them by March 2.
