Scholarships

The University of La Verne offers competitive merit scholarships to all qualified international undergraduate applicants. There is no separate application process. All applicants are considered upon review of a completed and timely submitted application. Scholarships are automatically renewed for all students in good academic standing with a minimum GPA of 3.0.

Freshman Scholarships

We award scholarships based on a combination of cumulative GPA and test scores. Multiple test scores may be submitted, but only one test score is required for your application. A student may only receive one scholarship. All awards listed are annual amounts.

Applying for Financial Aid

U.S. citizens and permanent residents are encouraged to apply for financial aid. International students are not eligible for financial aid.

All applicants seeking need-based financial aid must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **studentaid.gov.**

1 October is the opening day to begin filing the FAFSA. (La Verne's FAFSA code: 001216)

Letter of Recommendation

☐ Have a teacher, academic counselor, supervisor, etc., write us a letter about your work ethic and character. You can upload your letter or send an invitation directly to your recommender through the application portal.

STEP 6

Test Scores

- ☐ If you are applying for freshman admission, please submit official test scores from one of the below exams.
- The La Verne identification code for the SAT is 4381. A minimum score of 460 on the evidence-based reading and writing section of the SAT is required.
- The La Verne identification code for the ACT is 0295. A minimum score of 19 on the English section of the ACT is required.
- The La Verne identification code for the TOEFL is 4381. A minimum score of 80 with acceptable bandwith scores is required.
- A minimum score of 6.5 on the IELTS with acceptable bandwith scores is required.
- A minimum score of 105 on the Duolingo English Test is required.

Please note: Test scores may be submitted as part of the transcript. We will accept unofficial test scores for admission consideration, but we will need final official test scores for scholarship consideration.
