

PROGRAMS The Lewis Family Engaged Departments have created synergistic opportunities between the University and local retirement and healthcare organizations, science academies, and the town of Jurupa Valley with the goal of enhancing community health and strengthening the healthcare services in the region.

Program, Faculty, and Staff Standouts

- PROFESSOR OF ANTHROPOLOGY DR. FELICIA BEARDSLEY was part of the team that added the Micronesian ruins of Nan Madol to the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization's (UNESCO) World Heritage List.
- DR. CHRISTINE MA-KELLAMS, assistant professor of psychology, partnered with Harvard University professor Jennifer Lerner to publish "Trust Your Gut or Think Carefully?" The study, which revealed that gut instinct might not help us understand others, has been featured in New York Magazine, Forbes, and on BBC's Radio London.
- EXCELENCIA IN EDUCATION, a Washington, D.C.-based research group, released a report highlighting successful methods used by the University of La Verne to enroll, retain, and graduate Latino Students.
- THE FIRST GROUP OF 20 STUDENTS in the Master of Science Physician Assistant Practice degree program is expected to start in June 2017, pending provisional accreditation by the **Accreditation Review Commission** on Education.
- THE COLLEGE OF LAW received full accreditation from the American Bar Association, an accomplishment gained through the implementation of innovative programs that have increased accessibility, enrollment, and success for its students.


Student Successes




