Scholarships

\$4,229,000

In honor of his late wife, Heshmat, and her wish inspired through years of teaching in Iran to help deserving students in need, Dr. Taghi Mirsepassi used money Heshmat had saved and additional funds to establish the \$1 million Heshmat Mirsepassi Endowed Scholarship. Supporting Muslim students in financial need, it was one of 14 named scholarships created at La Verne during 2016-2017.

Chairs **Professorships** & Lectureships

Filling endowed chairs created through generous contributions by the Fletcher Jones Foundation, Dr. David Bickford, an international expert in biodiversity, was recruited as the Fletcher Jones Endowed Chair in Biology, and Dr. Tatiana Tatarinova, a leading computational scientist, as the Fletcher Jones Endowed Chair in Computational Biology.

Centers

\$1,170,000

The Center for Neurodiversity, Learning and Wellness in the LaFetra College of Education marks a paradigm shift for students and teachers dealing with autism, attention deficit/ hyperactivity disorder or other learning challenges. Funded through the record \$10 million gift from University Trustee Tony LaFetra in 2015-2016, the center puts the spirit of the learner above the diagnosis.

Capital

\$1,104,000

On the 125th anniversary of Founders Day, La Verne broke ground on a fivestory, nearly 400-bed residence and dining hall envisioned as part of a larger student village at the southeast corner of the main campus. Slated to open in August 2018, the hall will have ample parking, thanks to the University's new five-level parking structure, which has 944 spaces and sustainable features such as solar panels to help meet the campus' energy needs.



Programs

\$7,559,000

For 60 years, La Verne's Summer Service Program has aided students' leadership development, personal and spiritual growth, and social responsibility. Providing volunteer opportunities that benefit the community, the program welcomes students of all religious, philosophical and secular perspectives. Over the past decade, donors have given nearly \$100,000 to the program and pledged more than \$450,000 in future support.

New Alumni Donors During Three-Year Challenge

Alumni Counted, **Challenge Exceeded!**

Leos from around the world doubled down on an anonymous donor's three-year challenge to increase the number of new alumni donors at La Verne by more than 1,000. In all, the "Count Me In" Challenge, which began in 2014, added nearly 1,900 new alumni donors, bucking a national trend in declining alumni engagement. As a result, the University received the full \$500,000 challenge award.

TAYLOR BRISTOL WARNER AND **CRISTA HAYNES** credit the scholarships they received in the La Verne College of Law for allowing them to excel in their studies and be active student leaders. A recipient of the Joseph & Doleen Borba Scholarship, Taylor served as Chief Managing Editor of the University's Law Review and founded the La Verne Public Interest Law Foundation. Crista, a recipient of the Paul Egly Scholarship, was Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Law, Business & Ethics. Upon earning their law degrees in 2011, the pair hoped one day to reciprocate their donors' generosity by supporting law student scholarships of their own. Little did they know

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that "one day" would come sooner than they thought or that they would endow a scholarship together from the success of their own law firm, Bristol & Haynes.

First awarded for 2016-2017, the Bristol Haynes Leadership Endowed Scholarship supports a top College of Law student who has shown exemplary leadership in student organizations or clinics. From excavating bones in Africa to teaching schoolchildren in China, nearly 40 La Verne students kept busy this past summer researching and teaching in field schools around the world, thanks to research awards that put their classroom learning into real-world practice.

The College of Business and Public Management's 2017 REACH Summer Business Camp brought 56 motivated, mostly first-generation high school seniors to La Verne to learn first-hand what university life is like. Donors gave nearly \$34,000 to help make the three-week residential program possible.

In the University's largest government grant ever, the U.S. Department of Education awarded La Verne \$6 million to increase the number of Latino students graduating with Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) degrees.

Thanks to the artists, patrons and subscribers, the inaugural season of Lyceum @ La Verne offered an array of culturally diverse performances and lectures that celebrated and advanced the arts at La Verne and in the community.

Lifted Up By His La Verne Family

A FIRST-GENERATION COLLEGE **STUDENT** from a tough part of Southern California, De Vonte Moore '18, Chemistry (Biology minor), felt a weight on his shoulders when he arrived at La Verne. "That first year was hard. I was representing my family, working two jobs and struggling with the transition," he said. "My Summer Service Program experience was the turning point. It got me away from negative influences in my neighborhood. I lived with a family in Washington State for 10 weeks and it changed my perspective on people and culture."

That fall, De Vonte became more involved on campus. His membership in the Brother's Forum student group led to College of Law Dean Emeritus Gilbert Holmes becoming his mentor. In his junior year, based on faculty recommendations, he was awarded the Robert & Mary Neher Biology Scholarship, which helped financially and boosted his confidence. "It validated my hard work and told me someone out there cared enough to help," said De Vonte, who subsequently earned internships at Colorado State University and USC. "The collective support of my La Verne family – donors, professors and advisors – has shaped who I am academically and personally, and pushed me to the next level. I couldn't be more thankful."
