UNDERGRADUATE SPECIAL COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

*SOC 314 & SOC 334: Not part of the Criminal Justice & Criminology degree program (CJC)

*CS 305: In addition to the discussions and written assignments, students are required to complete a **minimum of 20 hours** of community service. It is recommended that students complete CS 305 at least two terms prior to their anticipated graduation date.

*HUM 313 (Dr. Clark): Requires independent fieldtrips to 6 museums and 4 plays. No text book is required for this course.

- **HUM 313 Attendance Policy:** In keeping with the "Class Attendance" policy contained in the University's catalog, **students who do not submit the first week's assignment by midnight of Sunday, June 16, will be administratively dropped from HUM 313 online by Tuesday, June 18.** This assignment, a report on a museum visit or on attendance at an approved performance of drama, dance, music, or opera, is due at midnight on Sunday of the first week of classes (June 16), and the last day to drop (or be administratively dropped) from Summer 2019 Term courses with a 100% refund is Tuesday, June 18, 2019.

*MATH 104: Requires an online proctoring fee of up to \$14 per exam. There are 4 tests in a term.

***BUS 496 (Dr. Dietz): Attendance Policy.** In keeping with the “Class Attendance” policy contained in the University’s catalog, **students who do not log into the course and post by Thursday, June 13, will be administratively dropped from the Summer 2019 term.**
