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^{*}CS 305: In addition to the discussions and written assignments, students are required to complete a minimum of 20 hours of community service. It is recommended that students complete CS 305 at least two terms prior to their anticipated graduation date.

^{*}HUM 313 (Dr. Clark): Requires independent fieldtrips to 6 museums and 4 plays. No textbook is required for this course.

HUM 313 Attendance Policy: In keeping with the "Class Attendance" policy contained in the University's catalog, students who do not submit the first week's assignment by midnight of Sunday, January 12, will be administratively dropped from HUM 313 online by Wednesday, January 15th. This assignment, a report on a museum visit or on attendance at an approved performance of drama, dance, music, or opera, is due at midnight on Sunday of the first week of classes (January 12), and the last day to drop (or be administratively dropped) from Winter 2020 Term courses with a 100% refund is Tuesday, January 14, 2020.
