My Degree Tracker – Understanding the Audit

Overview

My Degree Tracker is a web-based degree audit and student advising tool that provides a clear and convenient method for students and advisors to track degree progress. It is intended to assist students in reaching their academic goals and to achieve a better understanding of their degree requirements.

Audit Types

There are two types of audits: real and what-if.

- "Real" Audit (Student View Audit Report) processes a student's coursework against the requirements associated with the student's degree data from the student system.
- "What-if" Audit processes a student's coursework against the requirements associated with pretend degree data and/or pretend coursework. The what-if feature is valuable when a student wants to see "what" the audit results would be "if" the major, minor, concentration, specialization, or catalog year were changed or if the student completes future planned courses.

Student View Audit Report

The Student View Audit Report lists all requirements necessary to complete a specific degree program including: courses needed, courses taken, courses currently being taken, how each requirement was satisfied, waivers/substitutions, challenge exams, transfer credits and much more.

Summary Block

Each audit will have a block of information at the top which provides an overview of the student's enrollment and status. The block includes*:

Progress Bars

A graphic representation of a student's overall academic progress is seen via the "Degree Progress" bars.



- Requirements
 - Percentage of degree requirements completed overall.
- Semester Hours
 - This percentage is calculated by tracking the number of units a student has completed against the total number of units required for the degree. This does not include excess elective units.

Degree Block

The Degree Block specifies University of La Verne degree requirements and the student's completion status in reference to these requirements. The degree requirements are inclusive of university policies and program specific requirements based on a student's chosen course of study.

Other

Still Needed – Click on a "Still Needed" course (Ex. BUS 330) to link to the course catalog. By doing this, a new window will appear with the course description and any attached attributes. This feature also works when you click on an attribute such as "LVHU". Clicking on the attribute will open a new window which will provide a list of courses with the specified attribute.

Transfer coursework – Courses transferred to La Verne are identified on the audit with 0XX, 1XX or 3XX and list the name of the transferring institution.

Best Fit

Each time an audit is run, the Auditor Engine evaluates the student course data against the appropriate requirement blocks, determining which academic requirements have been satisfied and which await completion. Requirements are filled with courses based on the system's "best fit" algorithm. The

Auditor Engine (algorithm) determines where a class should be placed when it fits on multiple requirements and it also prioritizes which course will be used to fulfill a requirement when two courses have the same "best fit".

Non-course Requirements

The My Degree Tracker audit system allows for the use of non-course requirements. These requirements may include: theses, performances, attendance at required events, work experiences and application for graduation. Currently, this functionality is not being used for undergraduate programs, but will be added in the future.
